EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Endeavour in collaboration with PwC have evaluated key indicators across Endeavour's programmes for the period from September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022.

This report illustrates the outcomes which align with Endeavour's goals, and demonstrates how Endeavour's programmes and initiatives are achieving measurable results and a positive impact in the community.

KEY FINDINGS

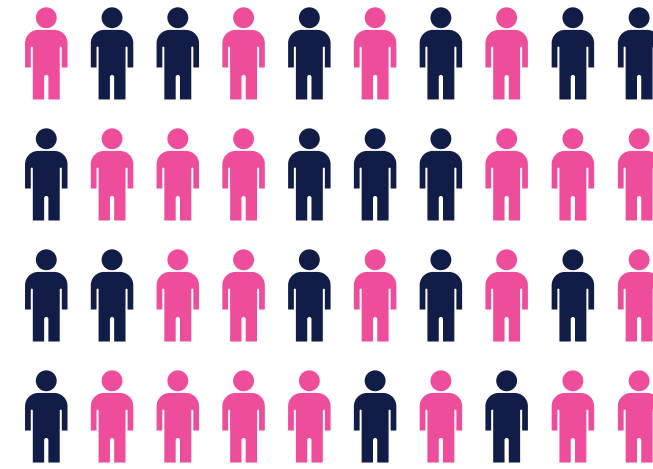
Endeavour continues to receive positive feedback in relation to its work with Bermuda's youth. Testimonials from youth participants, teachers, and parents highlight the positive impact that Endeavour creates for young people across Bermuda who engage in Endeavour's programmes.

Findings demonstrate that as a result of participating in Endeavour's programmes:

- Endeavour **connects diverse youth** from across Bermuda while engaging them in hands-on learning activities featuring Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math or **STEAM education through sailing**.
- Students are **more interested in learning about STEAM subjects** and have an **improved understanding of science and math concepts**.
- Youth participants **develop life skills** including **problem-solving, communication, teamwork and leadership and build their self-confidence**.
- **Young people of all backgrounds, skills and abilities are exposed to sailing opportunities**, with many indicating their first sailing experience is through Endeavour.
- **Young Bermudians have a greater awareness of maritime career pathways** and are better prepared for securing employment with **enhanced skills, hands-on experience and industry connections**.

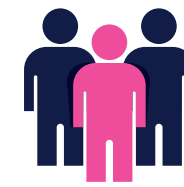

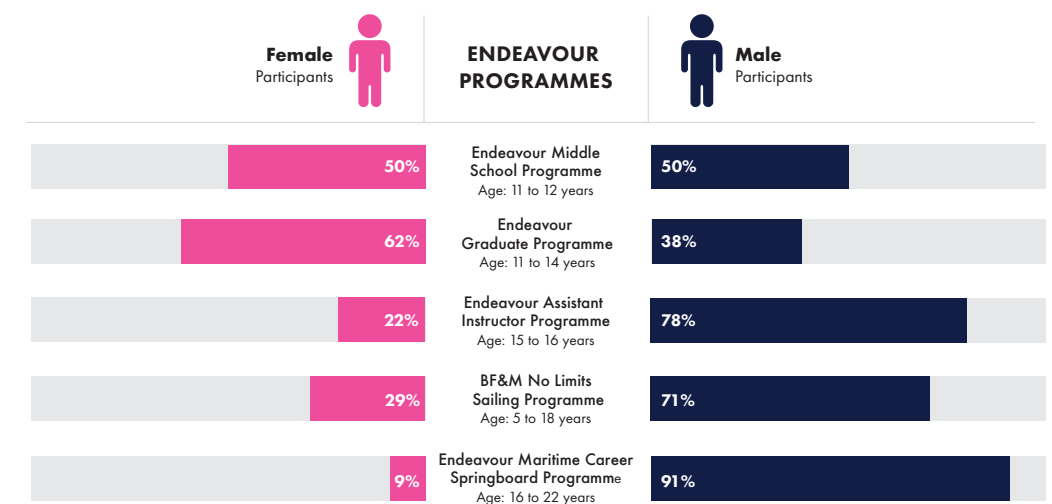


From September 1, 2021, to August 31, 2022:

849

YOUNG PEOPLE

were engaged in Endeavour's Programmes.



849 students from **13** schools in Bermuda gained access to over **1,500** hours of experiential education during the 2021-2022 school year including over **500** hours of academic instruction in math and science.



223 students aged 12-13 years, from **12** schools, were engaged in the Endeavour Graduate Programme in 2021-2022.



25 Assistant Instructors volunteered **1,070** hours of community service in July and August 2022 to support students learning to sail in the Endeavour Graduate Programme.



14 students aged 15-16 years, from **7** schools, completed a week-long training to develop their coaching skills and were successful in achieving their Assistant Instructor certification in July 2022.

ENROLMENT IN ENDEAVOUR'S PROGRAMMES

See below for school enrolment for students who engaged in Endeavour's programmes during the 2021-2022 school year.

Endeavour Middle School Programme

Enrolment in the Endeavour Middle School Programme is tied directly to school enrolment as this opportunity is offered to EVERY student.

100% of students in their first year of middle school from all public, private and home schools in Bermuda engaged in the 2021-2022 Endeavour Middle School Programme: **570** students comprised **230** public school students, **335** private school students and **5** home school students.

Endeavour Graduate Programme

Students are invited to continue to develop their skills and knowledge in the Endeavour Graduate Programme based on their participation in the Endeavour Middle School Programme with an emphasis on students who have never sailed before and who are interested to continue sailing.

Out of **151** students who engaged in the 2022 Endeavour Graduate Programme: **73** were from public schools and **78** were from private schools.

BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme in partnership with Endeavour

28 students from **five** public schools engaged in the 2021-2022 BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme.

Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme

Out of **14** students who engaged in the 2022 Assistant Instructor Programme: there were **4** public school students, **1** GED student, **5** private school students and **4** attended boarding schools overseas.

Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme

Out of **14** students who engaged in the 2022 Endeavour Maritime Springboard Programme: there were **7** public school students, **1** private school student, **2** home school students, and **4** high school graduates.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

100%

of students reported they are more confident, have improved their problem-solving skills and are more willing to take on new challenges after participating in the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme.

100%

of parent respondents indicated their child enhanced their communication skills after participating in the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme with Endeavour.

100%

of young Bermudians believe that they have enhanced their teamwork and communication skills following their completion of the Endeavour Maritime Springboard Programme.

97%

of students reported they improved their problem solving skills as a result of participating in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

82%

average pass rate achieved by participants in the Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme across nine Royal Yachting Association (RYA) qualifications, which is impressive as many had limited or no sailing experience before the programme.

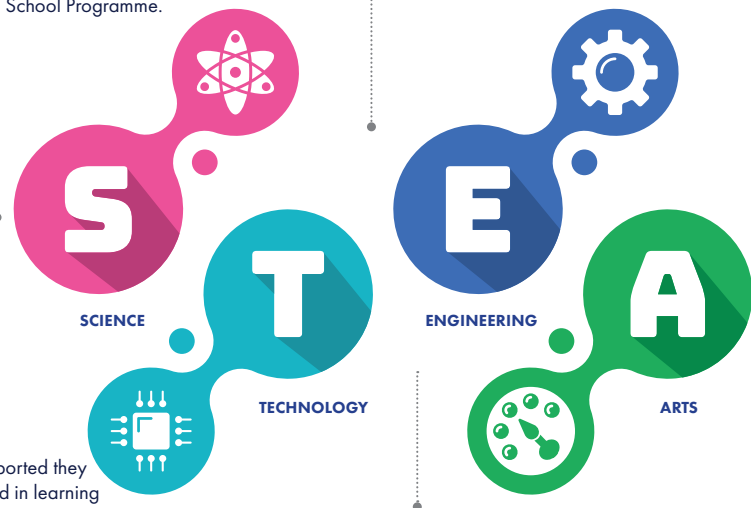

Endeavour is committed to inclusivity across all of our programmes toward ensuring that young people of all backgrounds, skills, and abilities have access to opportunities. Endeavour's STEAM through Sailing programmes are grounded in inquiry, problem-solving and active engagement to enrich the learning experience while encouraging exploration and discovery from diverse perspectives.

100% of teacher respondents believe that Endeavour's STEAM activities align with their lesson plan and in-class curriculum and believe that students were more interested in learning about STEAM subjects as a result of participating in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

70% of students reported they were more aware of STEAM career pathways as a result of participating in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.



88% of students reported they were more interested in learning about Science, 83% reported an increased interest in Math and 94% reported an increased interest in learning about Engineering after participating in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

75% of students reported that they improved their understanding of STEAM education concepts as a result of participating in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

570 students ages 11 to 12 years old from 13 schools engaged in hands-on STEAM activities learning about sailing geometry, buoyancy, wind power and wind measurement, marine conservation and Bermuda's maritime history during the Endeavour Middle School Programme.



WHAT IS STEAM EDUCATION?

A report from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics projects growth in STEM and STEAM-related occupations of 8% between now and 2029, compared to 3.4% for non-STEM occupations.

STEAM education is a holistic, interdisciplinary approach to learning that combines science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics. It harnesses the natural symbiosis between these disciplines to foster creative problem-solving, collaboration and critical thinking. STEAM-based learning equips students with the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in the 21st century. STEAM education helps develop the 4 C's of 21st century skills - collaboration, creativity, creative thinking, and communication, which are vital components to help young people succeed in a rapidly changing workforce and society.

As humanity faces increasing change, challenges and complexity, we need people with the ability to ask the right questions and find new solutions. STEAM - with its focus on not only the "how" and "what" but also the "who" and "why" - is specifically designed to develop future innovators. It allows learners to create meaning for themselves and others. It encourages students to approach real-world scientific problems with consideration for their impact on humanity.

STEAM is at its heart about innovation, and innovation is about more than developing the latest gadget. Innovation is one of the keys to solving the most pressing problems of our time and ensuring a healthy, sustainable future.

ENDEAVOUR PROGAMMMES



01. ENDEAVOUR MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMME

The Endeavour Middle School Programme engages every student aged 11-12 years old in a five-day interactive STEAM through Sailing learning experience from all public schools, private schools, and home schools across the Island.

Endeavour's inquiry-based curriculum combines Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math or STEAM hands-on learning with practical sessions on the water to complement what students learn at school. By creating connections between what they are learning on the water and in the classroom, students become more excited about learning and strengthen their understanding of math and science. Endeavour's STEAM through sailing curriculum includes modules on sailing geometry, buoyancy, wind power and measurement, simple machines, and mechanical advantage, sailing fundamentals, weather patterns, ocean conservation, and Bermuda's maritime heritage.

Learning modules are aligned with the Cambridge curriculum math and science learning objectives that are implemented in Bermuda's public schools. Students report an increased interest in learning about STEAM as a result of their participation in the programme.

Students also report they experience improved self-confidence, and enhanced life skills including teamwork, communication and problem-solving. Students also report a greater awareness of the importance of environmental stewardship and appreciation of Bermuda's rich maritime history as a result of participating.

Student participation is made possible through Endeavour's long-standing collaboration with the Bermuda Ministry of Education and schools to ensure that lessons are relevant and enrich learning as students build on what they are learning in the classroom during their time at Endeavour.

The Endeavour Middle School Programme develops critical thinkers and helps prepare Bermuda's youth for a rapidly changing world. The programme is designed in a way that allows participants to learn through inquiry.



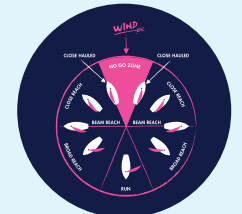
BUOYANCY

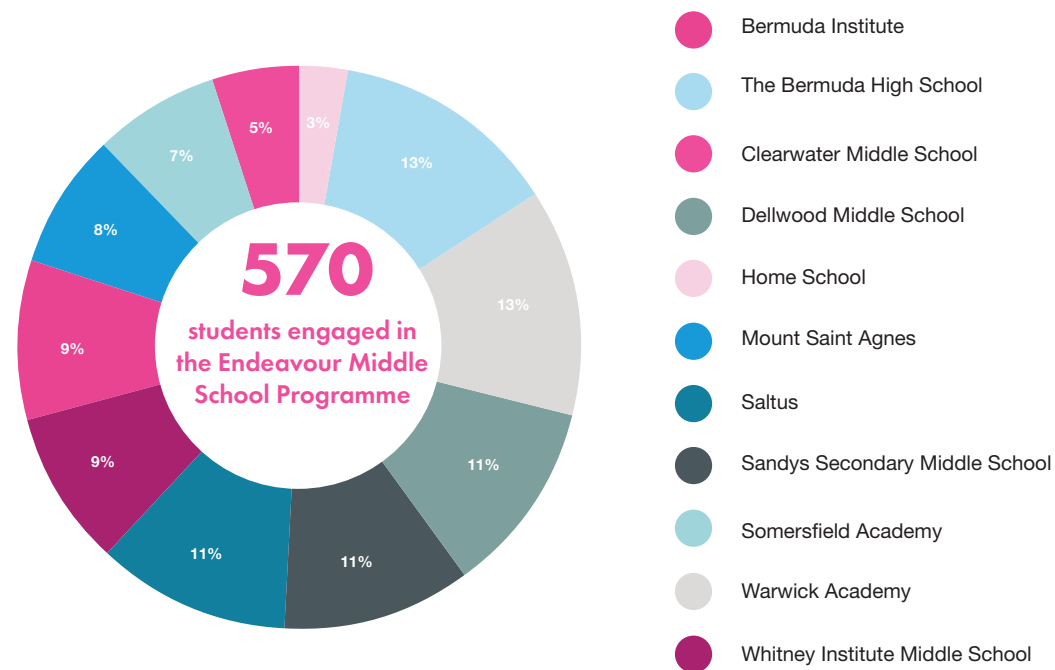

Below represents student participation from each of the schools in the 2021 - 2022 programme.



Lessons engage students through hands-on learning activities based on STEAM concepts that are applicable for sailing. The programme aims to inspire an enthusiasm for learning about STEAM and sailing and expose students to STEAM-related career pathways.

Each week two different groups of students and teachers engage in hands-on activities at two locations from Monday to Thursday from 9am to 3:30pm at Endeavour East in St. George's and Endeavour West in Dockyard, then both groups come together on Friday in Dockyard.

Endeavour partners with the Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre SunSmart Programme and is grateful to Azuree Williams who dedicates time with each group to share about the importance of practising SunSmart behaviours and healthy habits with respect to sun protection.

As part of Endeavour's commitment to eliminate single-use plastics and promote sustainability, all participants in Endeavour's programmes receive a reusable water bottle. Students and teachers join Endeavour team members each week for a beach clean-up and have collected thousands of plastics and other debris, followed by a discussion of ways of living more sustainably.

Endeavour partners with the National Museum of Bermuda to provide students with an interactive and educational scavenger hunt focused on Bermuda's rich maritime heritage. Students also have an exciting opportunity to learn about the physics of sailing and apparent wind on Blo'Karts (land sailing vessels).

Endeavour is committed to ensuring the best possible learning experience for everyone who participates in Endeavour's programmes. To this end the Endeavour team is constantly evolving lesson plans and working with our educational partners to ensure positive outcomes for participants.

Endeavour is grateful for support from the dedicated educators from our partner schools.

119 teachers contributed **2,580** hours of support for the Endeavour Middle School Programme during the 2021-2022 school year.

100% of teacher respondents believe that students benefited from their participation in the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

100 % of Teachers were satisfied with:

- The quality of students' in-class experience
- The alignment of Endeavour's STEAM activities with their lesson plans and in-class curriculum

Teacher respondents stated their students' interest in the following STEAM subjects increased after their experience in the Endeavour Middle School Programme. Out of all the participants:

92% of students are more interested in

- Science
- Engineering
- Mathematics
- Technology
- Art & Design

ENDEAVOUR'S MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMME: STUDENT FEEDBACK

02. ENDEAVOUR GRADUATE PROGRAMME

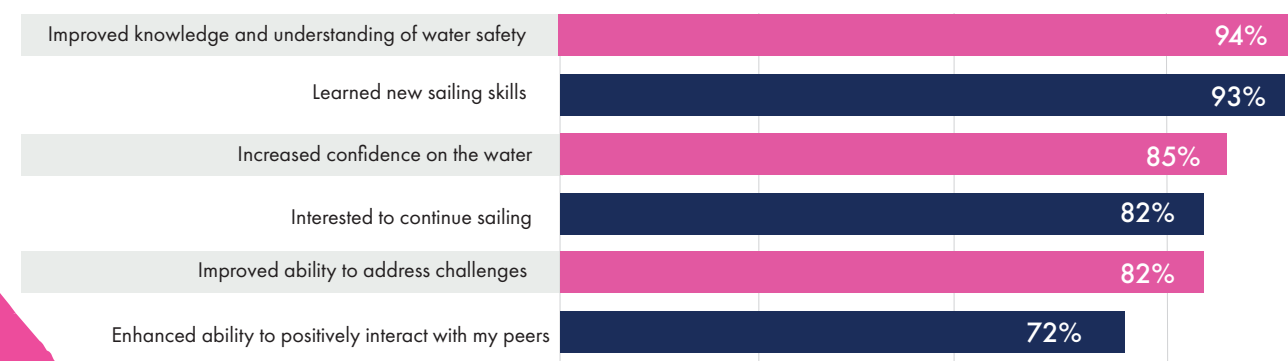
The Endeavour Graduate Programme offers a pathway for students ages 12-14 years who have completed the Endeavour Middle School Programme to continue to develop their skills. Students are evaluated based on teamwork, respect for others, listening skills, willingness to learn, and overall effort as well as their interest to continue learning to sail during the Endeavour Middle School Programme.

Students with the highest values are invited to return for training sessions during the summer, and school breaks and weekends during the fall and spring terms.

This programme brings together diverse students while developing their skills on and off the water, representing one of Endeavour's goals which is to integrate youth from different backgrounds from across Bermuda. Some students and their families have reported that they would not have met otherwise, and new friendships have formed.

72 students took part in the Endeavour Graduate Programme during the fall 2021 and spring 2022 terms, and **151** new students were engaged from **12** schools during the 2022 summer programme.

Endeavour Graduates were asked if they agreed or disagreed with the following statements based on their Endeavour experience. The chart below displays the percentage that agreed with the statement:

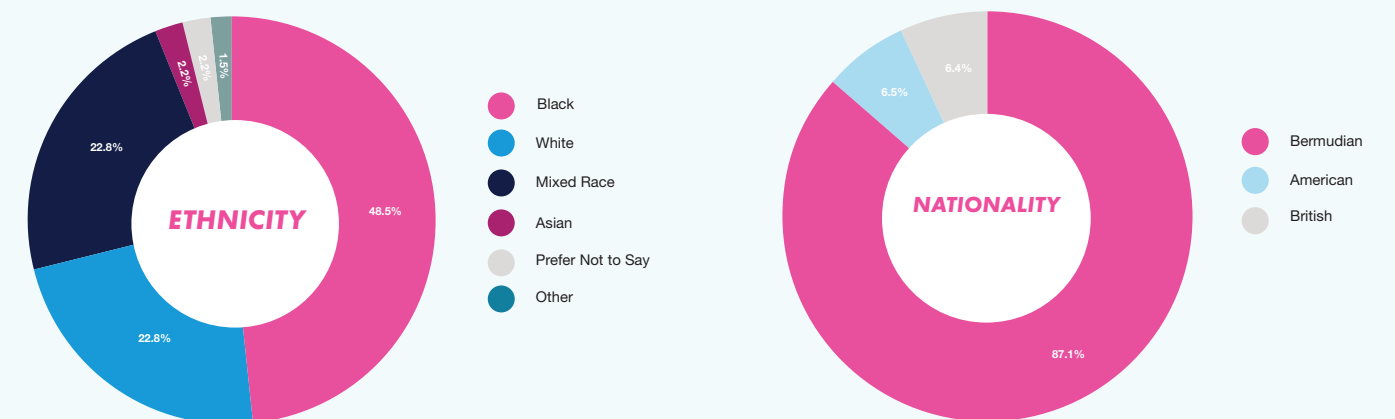

ETHNICITY AND NATIONALITY

The key findings from the Endeavour Graduate Survey captured the ethnicity and nationality of the participants. A total of 136 responses were received and are summarised below:



ENDEAVOUR GRADUATES HAVE ACCOMPLISHED A LOT!

HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE

- **Six** Endeavour Grads took part in the 2021 Bermuda National and Open Optimist Championships for their first regatta experience. They represented **five** schools: Bermuda Institute, Clearwater Middle School, Dellwood Middle School, Mount Saint Agnes Academy, and Sandys Secondary Middle School.
- Endeavour's commitment to gender equality and empowerment of all women and girls throughout its programmes aligns with Goal 5 of the United Nations UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- Endeavour's 2022 Women on the Water event brought together **21** female youth sailors aged 11-19 years for a fun-filled day of empowerment and inspiration in honour of International Women's Day. This UN-sanctioned global event recognises the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women, raises awareness, and marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity, and inspires support for organisations that support women around the world.
- Endeavour's Women on the Water event inspires, empowers, and connects diverse female youth across Bermuda in a fun, safe, and inclusive environment. This fun-filled day brings together female sailors of all skills and abilities to get to know each other while fostering their interest in sailing and maritime opportunities and providing opportunities to build their confidence, skills and network.
- Students represented **12** schools including: Bermuda Centre for Creative Learning, Bermuda Institute, CedarBridge Academy, Sandys Secondary Middle School, The Berkeley Institute, The Bermuda High School, Mount Saint Agnes, Saltus, Somersfield Academy, Warwick Academy, Whitney Institute Middle School, and home schools.

03. ENDEAVOUR ASSISTANT INSTRUCTOR PROGRAMME

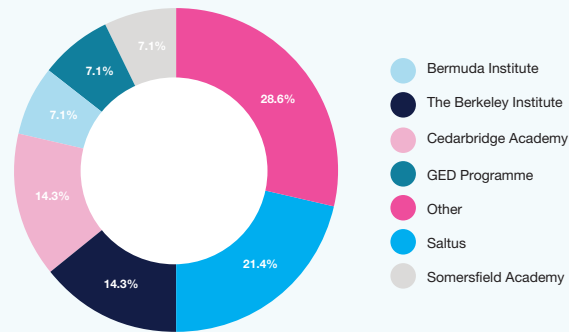
The Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme offers a leadership development opportunity for students **ages 15 years and older** who have completed the Endeavour Graduate Programme.

The programme focuses on coaching and advanced sailing skills for high school students interested in becoming sailing coaches. After successfully completing the programme and achieving their Assistant Instructor certificate they are invited to volunteer to assist with the Endeavour Graduate Programme and gain community service credit.

In July 2022, **14** students participated in the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme, of which **100%** successfully achieved their Assistant Instructor (AI) certification, and joined returning AI volunteers to dedicate **1,070** hours of community service in July and August 2022.

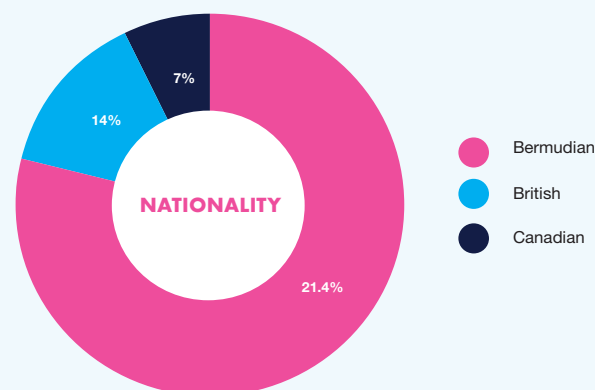
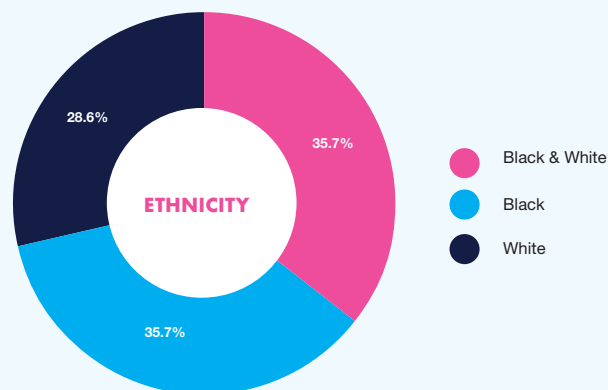
Students represented **seven** schools; the chart below represents participation from each of the schools.

ETHNICITY AND NATIONALITY

The key findings from the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Survey captured the ethnicity and nationality of the participants. All participants responded to the survey and their responses are summarised below:



“ It was most exciting when my son Kimon achieved his Assistant Instructor certification. He loves sailing because of Endeavour and the fact that he can grow within the programme is something that he does really enjoy.

My son showed interest in sailing, but due to costs involved with the sport we didn't think it was possible. Endeavour's programmes provided a first encounter, giving him the chance to discover whether it was something he really liked, and it gave him a lot of knowledge about what to do on the water and safety. He completed the Endeavour Graduate Programme then the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme and has continued to sail with the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club on different boats. Endeavour is providing my son with opportunities and showing him paths for career and personal development.

My son is a very quiet child and not confident with public speaking, however being part of Endeavour's Assistant Instructor Programme requires him to help other children discover the wonderful parts of sailing and his confidence level has risen. He takes pride in what he is doing and speaks up more and looks forward to the programme. Over the holidays he had to wake up at 6am to catch the bus to be on time to volunteer with Endeavour. My son would want the programme to be on every day if possible.

Endeavour is definitely improved access and interest in youth sailing in Bermuda. Endeavour has opened up the doorway for a lot of things in Bermuda. Other family members have been involved in Endeavour's programmes and other parents are showing interest and asking questions.

Endeavour is beneficial to Bermuda and gives the opportunity for young people to see what is available, career-wise, as it has never been an option for many and their interest continues to grow. With Endeavour being more seen on the island and with more families getting involved, it will continue to grow and may encourage other programmes to come out of this. ”

“ My son's favourite Endeavour experience was the Bermuda Optimist Open Championship where children from all over the world were a part of it. He had only been sailing for two months and this was a very memorable experience for him.

Endeavour definitely develops skills amongst youth participants. My son is now an Assistant Instructor and he really enjoys it. Patience is the number one skill that has been developed. Other skills include how he interacts with others and all of the different things that he has learned through Endeavour's programmes. He talks about the terminology frequently and has learned to sail different kinds of boats.

My son's confidence has definitely increased as a result of participating in Endeavour's programmes. Before participating he was a quieter child and an introvert. However as an Assistant Instructor his ability to be out there, for example he's volunteering and supporting younger children learning to sail. As a mother looking on, I see how much my son appreciates being a part of it, teaching others what he has learned and I am very happy with how happy my son's involvement with Endeavour has been.

Endeavour is definitely improving access and interest in youth sailing in Bermuda. A lot more children are involved and want to be involved. A few parents have asked me how to get their children involved. Thank you to the donors and supporters who make Endeavour's work possible. It is truly amazing!

My son wants to share that because of Endeavour's work children's lives change for the better and he wishes the programme was even longer. His aim is to become an instructor at the age of 16 years old and continue with teaching children all over the Island. He is a young man with ambition to help change lives through Endeavour's programmes. ”

04. ENDEAVOUR MARITIME CAREER SPRINGBOARD PROGRAMME

The Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme is a seven-week career development initiative for young Bermudians aged 16 years and older who are seeking employment in the maritime industry, that equips them with training and career connections to build skills and broaden exposure to maritime career pathways.

2022 marks the fifth year of the programme and Endeavour's partnership with the Bermuda College Athora Division of Professional and Career Education (APACE) Division.

A key part of the programme includes interactive career site visits with a range of maritime employers to broaden awareness of the different career pathways and training opportunities available as well as providing tips for how to jumpstart their career while at the same time building a network of contacts in the maritime industry locally and overseas.

Young Bermudians benefit from maritime career exposure and exploration, skills development, practical training, and hands-on experience as well as growing their network of support so that they are better positioned to work in the maritime industry.

Young Bermudians also benefit from the opportunity to achieve internationally recognised qualifications from the Royal Yachting Association (RYA) including:

- RYA Sailing Levels 1, 2 and 3
- RYA First Aid
- RYA Seamanship
- RYA Safe & Fun Safeguarding
- RYA Powerboat Level 2
- RYA VHF Marine Radio - Short Range Certificate (SRC)
- RYA Safety Boat
- RYA Dinghy Instructor Award

14 Bermudians aged 16-21 years including **10** males and **four** females completed the 7-week programme from mid-January to the end of February 2022.

Students rated whether they agreed or disagreed with the following statements based on their experience with the Assistant Instructor Programme:

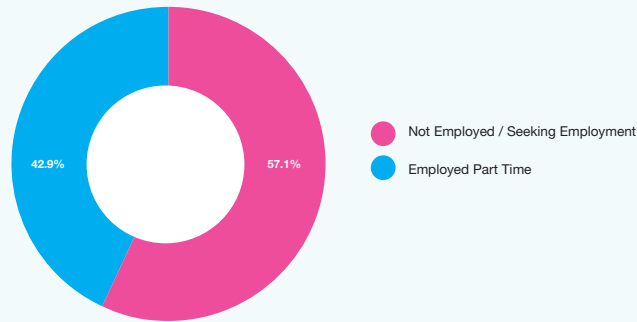
100 % of students:

- Are more confident.
- Have improved their problem-solving skills.
- Have improved their communication skills.
- Are a stronger leader.
- Are more willing to take on new challenges.
- Enjoy learning new skills.

Participants were 100% Bermudian

Ten participants were high school students who balanced their academic commitments while being immersed in the programme including **four** students from CedarBridge Academy, **three** students from The Berkeley Institute, **one** student from Saltus and **two** home school students.

Endeavour surveyed all 14 participants regarding their employment status prior to starting the programme. The majority of participants were students who were not employed and seeking employment at the start of the programme.



93% were extremely satisfied with their experience and agreed that the programme prepared them toward meeting their objectives and goals.

Participants were asked how they would rate their ability in the following skills now that they have completed the Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme:

100 % of participants are better able to

- Work on a team.
- Adapt to new surroundings.
- Communicate clearly.
- Identify their strengths and weaknesses.
- Solve problems.



“ I have so many fond memories from Endeavour. A favourite would be learning how to drive a powerboat as this was such a supportive experience. Participants were able to learn at the perfect pace on how to drive a powerboat. Sailing is not as popular of a sport as it should be in Bermuda given we are surrounded by water. Endeavour reaches out to all kids across the island to ensure that they are getting that experience on the water and opens their eyes to the possibility of being a sailor. ”

The Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme definitely develops skills amongst participants. For example, teamwork is very important and Endeavour made it so that everyone is involved with each other, like a little family. Everyone did everything together. There are other students learning alongside you and feedback is shared on how to improve throughout the programme. It was really good to have instructors who push a family dynamic and sense of community.

Also there is a lot of leadership that is developed as participants are encouraged to do their own projects. For example, public speaking where you are encouraged to explain what you are doing and how you are doing it to practise presentation skills. This was very good in developing social skills.

By participating in the Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme, my confidence increased. The results of my experience was something that I never even considered. I achieved my RYA Dinghy Instructor certificate along with other qualifications. Endeavour pushed me to be more vocal and now I am able to teach students and lessons with confidence.

Endeavour’s Middle School Programme is really good to improve access and interest in youth sailing in Bermuda. This means that every Bermudian has access to this experience if they are living in Bermuda.

I wish to give a shout out to the instructors who make learning a lot of fun and I really learned a lot from them. My experience in the Endeavour Maritime Springboard Programme changed my perspective and my entire career goals.

When I started the programme I was at the Bermuda College studying marine science, and unsure of what I really wanted to do. However since completing the programme I have narrowed down my career goals in the maritime industry and achieved additional skills, qualifications and experience including the Royal Yachting Association Yachtmaster Certificate of Competence, the Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping (STCW), as well as I have worked with several organisations including Rising Son, Sail Bermuda, and Endeavour. ”

Bermuda College and Endeavour continue to maximise their impact in the community through this dynamic collaborative effort. 05. BF&M NO LIMITS SAILING PROGRAMME WITH ENDEAVOUR

Endeavour facilitates the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme to provide experiential learning opportunities for students who are on the autism spectrum or have developmental challenges who are enrolled in public schools across Bermuda.

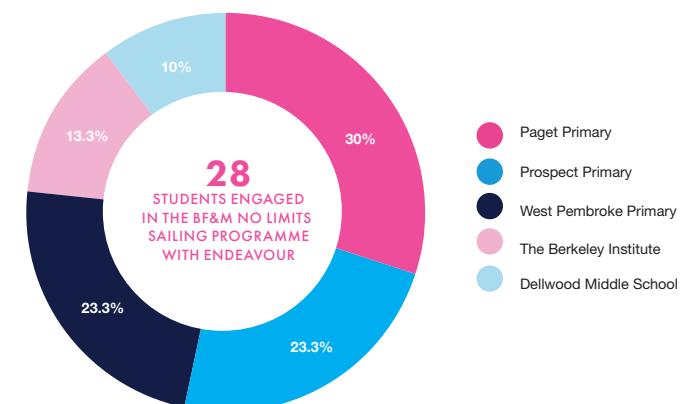
Students engage in hands-on sensory learning activities that focus on STEAM concepts applicable to sailing that are complimented by practical sessions on the water. Learning modules explore wind and weather patterns, buoyancy and sailing fundamentals in a safe and fun learning environment.

This programme takes place in September and April, which coincides with Autism Awareness month.

19 teachers contributed **434 hours** of support during the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme with Endeavour.

28 students **ages five years to 18 years old** from **three** public primary schools, **one** public middle school, and **one** public high school took part in the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme with Endeavour during the 2021-2022 school year. Displayed below are students engaged from each school.

BF&M NO LIMITS SAILING PROGRAMME PARENT FEEDBACK

Endeavour invited participants' families to provide their feedback via a survey, of which five responded.

100% of parents believe their child benefited greatly from participating in the programme.

Parents believe the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme has helped their child in the following ways:

- Ability to learn new things
- Communication skills
- Confidence
- Ability to focus on instructions and respond

“ My son is nonverbal but every time he knows that he is going on the boat he is over the moon and every day he has a great time and comes home [from Endeavour] as a totally different child. He definitely is in tune with listening more and is more focused as a result of participating in the programme. He has become so much more comfortable with the water, he loves to be in the water. He seems to be really comfortable with the instructors, they have a lot of patience and have been really helpful with him.

My son's confidence has increased as a result of participating in the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme with Endeavour, with him being nonverbal he tends to shy away from the group but now he wants to be involved. He saw that they were learning how to make a boat, how it will float/sink and he was fully engrossed in the entire experience. ”

BF&M NO LIMITS SAILING PROGRAMME TEACHER FEEDBACK

Endeavour invited feedback from teachers via surveys and focus groups. Five survey responses were received from teachers from the Berkeley Institute, Paget Primary, Dellwood Middle School, Prospect Primary, and West Pembroke Primary.

100% Of teachers reported their students benefited from their participation in the BF&M No Limits Sailing Programme in partnership with Endeavour, and are satisfied with the quality of their experience.

SAILING ORGANISATION PARTNERSHIPS

Endeavour provides support and pathways for young people who have completed Endeavour’s programmes and are interested to further advance their skills through sailing, with emphasis on supporting those who might not otherwise have access to sailing opportunities.

Endeavour is honoured to partner with youth sailing organisations across the island to increase access and exposure to sailing for Bermuda’s youth.

Endeavour is grateful to the Bermuda Optimist Dinghy Association and Bermuda Sailing Association for helping to secure scholarships and financial bursaries to support youth sailing activities at local sailing clubs and regattas, further improving access to sailing for youth across Bermuda.

Sailing organisations across Bermuda were surveyed by PwC to understand the impact that Endeavour’s programmes have on youth participation and retention in the sport. Of the 12 surveys distributed, **seven** responses were received.

DONOR FEEDBACK

Endeavour is the official community partner for the Bermuda SailGP event. Endeavour partnered with SailGP Inspire, SailGP's community, education and outreach initiative to create additional opportunities for Bermuda's youth to get involved with STEAM education through sailing and career development during the 2021 and 2022 Bermuda SailGP events.

- **75** youth engaged in SailGP Inspire Learning including Endeavour Grads & No Limits Sailors
- **36** youth engaged in SailGP Inspire Racing sailing RS Fevas and WASZPs
- **39** young Bermudians engaged in SailGP Inspire Career experiences including working with SailGP teams, photography, videography, on-water operations and race management, sustainability, and technical roles such as boat building and the wing department.

Young Bermudians who have completed Endeavour's programmes and wish to continue sailing at local clubs in Bermuda are eligible to apply for youth sailing scholarships.

4 Endeavour Grads received scholarships in Spring 2022 to continue sailing at 3 sailing clubs in Bermuda.

Funds raised also support opportunities for Bermudian youth to gain skills and experience around the world as part of the SailGP Inspire Careers Programme.

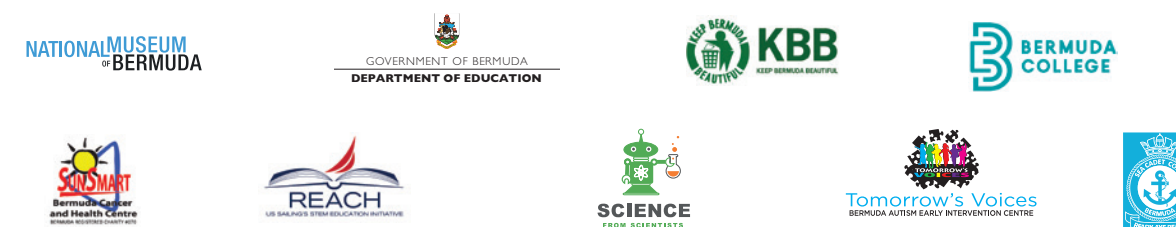

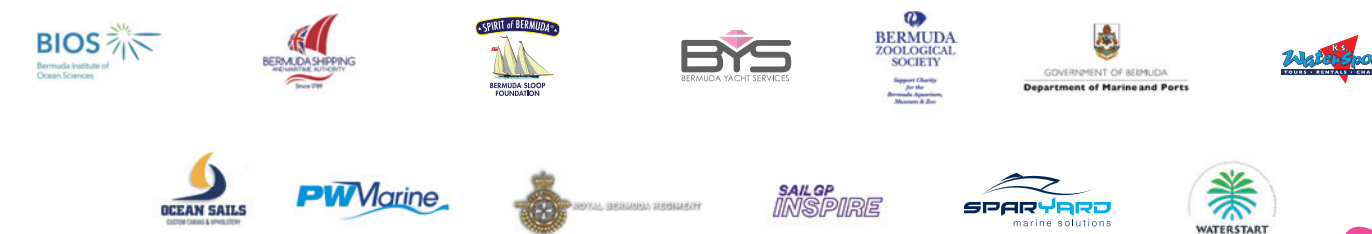

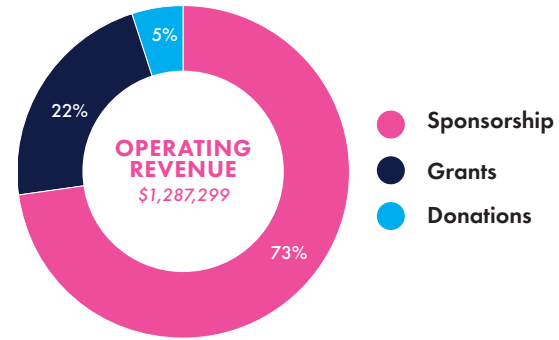

Revenue

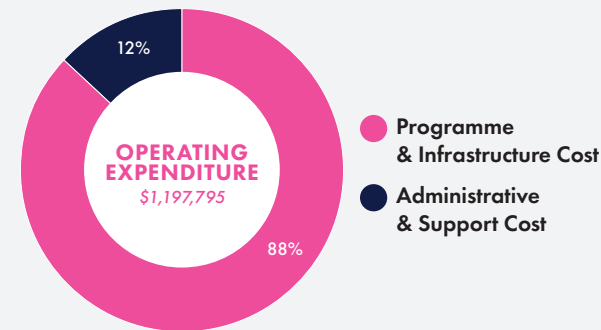
Endeavour raised \$1,287,299 during the period, 73% from sponsorship income, 22% from grants and 5% from donations and value in kind (VIK) support.



Expenditure

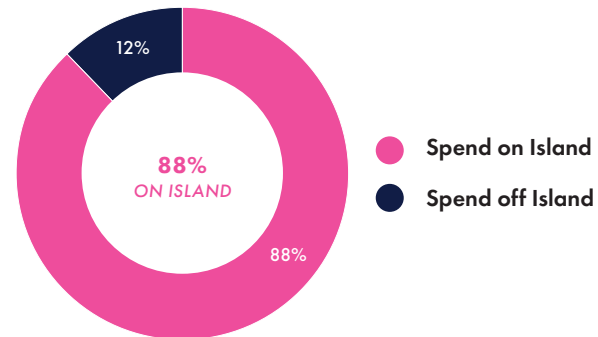
Total expenditure for the period was \$1,197,795 of which 88% relates to programme and infrastructure costs including salaries, programme materials, safety equipment, boat repairs and maintenance, and depreciation, and 12% represents administrative and support costs including business support, audit and accounting, marketing and other staff costs.
